
DO NOT KNOCK ORDINANCE

Orange Village has a new ordinance #2018-47 effective January 2, 2019, which will allow you to add your property to a "Do Not Knock Registry" in order to protect your home from unwanted solicitation. The list will be kept by the Orange Village Police Department and made available to anyone who registers with the police department to go door to door (addresses only). This list will advise the person of the properties who do not wish to receive uninvited guests, thus stopping them prior to entering onto your property.

It will be a violation of the law for a peddler to knock on the door or ring the doorbell of any property that is registered on the "Do Not Knock Registry". NO persons may knock on the door of a residence that has a sign which reads "Canvassers or Peddlers Prohibited" or No Trespassing. Orange Village will be supplying stickers to properties that are on the registry. This sticker will be another means for the canvassers or peddlers to know not to go on your property.

Dear Neighbors,

Spring is here! I hope everyone will take the opportunity to enjoy everything Orange Village has to offer. Take a walk in the park (soon, we will be able to walk to the park on our new recreational trails), enjoy a game of basketball, baseball, sand volleyball or pickleball. RECREATIONAL TRAILS UPDATE:

The construction of the trails has resumed and will take place throughout 2019. The plan is to have the trails completed by the end of the year. During construction there will be some roads that will be one-way only traffic. Signs will be posted in the affected areas.

VILLAGE HALL RENOVATIONS:

In 1995, when Orange Village Hall was newly constructed, our police department had 14 officers (we have grown to 18 officers) and two part time employees in the Building Department (we now have two full time and two part time employees in the building department to manage the vastly increased workload). In other words, we have outgrown the administrative space in Village Hall. Fortunately, the Village has the former church building located right next door. That building was renovated in 2014 and half of it became the Service Department’s administrative offices. The other half will soon become the new location of the Orange Village Building Department. This will provide them with the necessary space to serve our residents, their contractors and the voluminous rolls of blueprints processed through the department. The building department’s move next door will allow our police department to expand their offices. It will be wonderful for the officers, some of whom have been working out of former closets (literally). This project was authorized at the March 13, 2019 council meeting for an approximate cost of \$325,000 (including furnishings) which will be paid for with cash that was appropriated.

COMMUNITY GARDEN:

We have developed quite a successful community of gardeners. The members offer monthly meetings to learn and share gardening tips. Although the plots are already 100% reserved for 2019, everyone is welcome to join in the camaraderie and attend the monthly sessions. Each year, Orange Village residents are given priority sign-up before plots become available to non-residents. In a few months we will be able to see the fruits of their labor.

ORANGE COMMUNITY EDUCATION & RECREATION COMMISSION:

Thank you to Mr. John Driscoll for stepping up to serve as the Orange Village representative on the commission. He will represent our interests and any concerns our community residents may have.

BEAUTIFUL COMMUNITY:

Springtime is such a beautiful time as flowers bloom and everything turns green. It takes all of us to keep our community in good shape. At this time of year, there is always a great deal of litter and repair work that needs to be tended to at each of our homes. - ♥ Arrest/Court Scams (Scammers pose as law enforcement or court officials)
- ♥ IRS Scams (Callers pose as IRS agents)
- ♥ Computer Tech Scam (Callers pretend to be techs offering help with one’s computer)
- ♥ Sweepstakes/Lottery Scams
- ♥ Grandparent Scams (Callers pretend to be grandkids in trouble with the law)
- ♥ Robocalls (Tie with grandparent scams)
- ♥ Social Security or Medicare Scams
- ♥ Credit or Account Scams (Callers pose as banks or offer to lower credit rates)
- ♥ Charity Scam Calls
- ♥ Debt Collection Scams (Tie with charity calls)

Please call the Orange Village Police Department at 440-247-7321 if you suspect someone is trying to get you to part with your money, information or you are just not sure what to do. It’s most likely a scam even if it has the appearance of being official business.
