Who will be affected?

Cuyahoga County Voters who live in municipalities where precinct boundaries and/or Voting Locations have been changed, or are in the process of being changed. In the City of Cleveland Ward boundaries have changed.

What does this mean to voters?

Voters need to know their correct ward, precinct, and Voting Location to avoid issues when voting.

When?

Precinct boundary changes are happening now.

Why?

To improve efficiency and lower the cost of conducting elections. The precinct reduction program is expected lower the cost of elections for municipalities and Cuyahoga County by over two million dollars. In January of 2009 there were 1,436 precincts in Cuyahoga County. This number is being reduced to approximately 1,100 precincts. The Board of Elections is carefully making these adjustments while maintaining the number of voters per precinct to under 1,500 registered voters.

What do voters need to do?

- **Look:**

In your mailbox, the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections will send you a postcard if you are subject to any changes to your precinct or Voting Location.

- **Or, confirm your precinct and Voting Location at any time:**

Go the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections Web site at www.boe.cuyahogacounty.us.

Click on the blue "Voters" tab, then "Where Do I Vote?" Enter your home address and city, and the Website will provide your ward, precinct, and Voting Location.

- **If you do not have access to a computer:**

Call the Voter Information Hotline 216-443-3298 and ask for your precinct and Voting Location.
