
CodeRed - SIGN UP FOR NOTIFICATIONS

Dear Neighbor,

The summer of 2019 really flew by in Orange Village. Between the already-constructed recreational trails, the wonderful playground and our new pickleball court, we had a fun-filled and active use of our community park this summer.

RECREATIONAL TRAILS:

The remaining sections of the trails will continue to be worked on until the weather is prohibitive. The balance of the trails will be constructed in the spring of 2020. When they are completed, we will have over $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles of new trails throughout the village linking our neighborhoods to the Orange Village Community Park and Pinecrest.

It's been such a thrill seeing babies pushed in strollers, children riding their bicycles and so many walkers and joggers throughout the Village.

DEVELOPMENT UPDATES:

Pinecrest has been filling up their remaining retail spaces and over 90% of the tenant space is spoken for. Watch for new retail openings in the next few months along with four new restaurants. The apartments are at full occupancy and the office space is over 2/3's filled.

Across the street, a new BJ's Brewhouse will be coming soon and will be located next to Cooper's Hawk and in front of the Drury hotel, which is already under construction.

Planning & Zoning has been very busy with the many projects happening throughout the village, including the Lakes of Orange development. New homes are continuously being approved and new residents are making the Lakes of Orange their home. The developer of this subdivision, Kertes Enterprises Inc, has been named the "Best Green Home Construction Contractor – Northeast Ohio" by the national publication, Build. We are delighted to have this award winning development in Orange Village.

The Service Department is in the midst of upgrading our street signs. The old street signs will be available for purchase at our online auction. TRICK OR TREAT SAFETY TIPS

- Stay on sidewalks or walk on the left side of the road FACING traffic if sidewalks are not available.

All deliveries will be between 6pm and 9pm.

RECREATIONAL TRAILS CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The recreational trails are progressing. We now have the capability to walk/ride to our park on Brainard or Lander Roads south of Harvard Road. The contractor is currently working at the municipal center and on punch list items that were identified by the Village Engineer, this will take approximately 2-3 weeks. The tentative plan is to begin Harvard Road in October starting at Orange Place and moving east. If weather permits, Harvard Road trails between Lander and Brainard Roads will begin this year. When the contractor is working on the Harvard Road trails between Brainard and Lander Roads



the road will be closed to eastbound traffic and will only be open to westbound traffic. There will be signs and detour notifications placed in advance of this closure.

Residents on Harvard Road will receive a letter with detailed information concerning driveway access, mail delivery, trash pickup and placement of leaves for collection before construction begins.

PEDESTRIAN CROSSING - TRAIL SAFETY

The recreational trails are being installed throughout the Village. The trails are new to our community and we all have a responsibility to be vigilant of traffic on these trails whether it is a pedestrian crossing driveways or motorists that are entering or exiting a driveway.



Please take a moment to discuss the usage of our recreational trails with your family. Advise your children that every driveway should be considered an intersection and all who travel throughout the trails will need to focus on their own personal safety. Also as drivers, please back out or pull in your driveway carefully looking both ways to ensure there is not a pedestrian on the path.

In the end, this amazing network of trails will connect our residents to parks, neighborhoods and the Pinecrest development. Paramount to this improved accessibility is the safety of you and your family. Please take a moment to review the above suggestions with your family members so that we can all share these wonderful trails with safety in mind.


Looking to Preserve or Repair Your Home?

Placement of Your Refuse and Recycling Containers

Please place your containers 2 feet from the street with the lid opening facing the street and 3 feet from other objects. Place recycling on one side of your driveway and trash on the other.

HERITAGE

News from the Service Department

LEAF COLLECTION

- Collection begins October 14th and runs through November 27th
- Leaves should be placed close to the edge of the road. They should not extend onto the road. Leaves should be in a long row no farther off the road than 8 feet.
- Do not mix branches or foreign objects with the leaves. This can cause damage to the machine that picks up the leaves.
- ❖ The leaves will be turned into a rich compost that can be added to gardens and soil. The compost will be delivered next May to residents that request loads. Please place your orders early.
- Do not place leaves in ditches.

IF THE RECREATIONAL TRAIL IS IN FRONT OF YOUR HOME:

- > Leaves must be placed between the road and trails. No exception.
- > Residents with a large amount of leaves should make a long narrow row of leaves instead of one large pile. The row should not block the trails.
- > Our leaf machine will reach approximately 8 feet. Leaves farther than that will need to be brought closer to the road or they will not be collected.

Branch chipping is complete for 2019. We will not be chipping again until 2020. If you currently have branches out, they must be removed or you will be in violation of Ordinance 939.04.

SNOW PLOW CONTRACTORS MUST REGISTER



Please advise your contractor that they must obtain a written permit from the Village and a decal which should be prominently displayed on the registered vehicle(s). Instruct your snow plow service provider to apply with the Orange Village Building Department and pay an annual license fee in the amount of \$25.00 and \$5.00 for each additional vehicle. For your safety, please remind your contractor to keep snow and debris out of the roadway and do not block the fire hydrants.

FLOOD PROTECTION INFORMATION

In 1968, Congress created the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). This program provides flood insurance at a reasonable cost in exchange for the careful management of flood prone areas by local communities. The Village of Orange participates in the NFIP; you can protect your home and contents through the NFIP.

Homeowner's insurance polices do not cover damage from floods. However, because Orange Village participates in the National Flood Insurance Program, you can purchase a separate flood insurance policy. Flood insurance covers the building and its contents. Renters can insure their possessions. Everyone in the Village is eligible to purchase flood insurance. You do not have to live in the floodplain to qualify. Flood insurance covers all surface floods and can be purchased from a licensed insurance agent.

The Federal Government backs this insurance. There are two floodplains in the Village of Orange; a tributary to Tinker's Creek and Willey Creek. A detailed floodplain map is available at the Orange Branch of the Cuyahoga County Library. Fortunately, the Village has been spared from floods in recent history. This fact however should not make us complacent. Hydrologic studies indicate that under specific circumstances, the floodplain can and will someday flood. If you live in the floodplain, the odds are that someday your property will be damaged.

Do not accept statements from present owners, neighbors or sellers that a property in question has never been flooded. Investigate for yourself. The local library contains floodplain maps, instructions for interpreting these maps and flood protection publications. The Village Engineer, Service Department and Building Department can help you determine if your property is located in a Special Flood Hazard Area and provide assistance for drainage problems on or near your property. For technical assistance such as identifying the causes and ways of preventing or stopping flood damage to your property, please call the Village Engineer at 216-731-6255.

Several of the Village's efforts depend on your cooperation and assistance. Here is how you can help:

If you live next to a ditch or stream, please help keep the banks clear of debris and heavy vegetation.

- Do not dump or throw anything into ditches, streams and detention basins. Dumping in streams and ditches is a violation of local regulations; it should be reported to the Orange Service Department or Village Engineer immediately. Even yard waste can block an existing watercourse resulting in flooding.
- All development in the floodplain, not just building construction, requires a permit. Before you buy or build in the floodplain, contact the Building Department for details. Contact the Building Department or Village Engineer if you suspect illegal development in the floodplain.

There are several ways to minimize flood damage to your home. Regrading your property so that water is directed away from structures is an example of one of these methods. The Building Department or Village Engineer can help you with this. Also, installing a plug or standpipe can help eliminate minor sewer backup. Overhead plumbing is also a method for eliminating sewer backup for more severe cases of flooding. More information about these methods and other flood proofing and retrofitting measures are available at the Orange branch of the Cuyahoga County Library.

FLOOD SAFETY AND EVACUATION TIPS

- Plan escape routes to higher ground.
- During heavy rainfall, monitor the level of water in drainage ways. Stay tuned to local radio and television for possible flood warnings.
- Evacuate the flood hazard areas in times of impending flood or when advised to do so by the Police or Fire Department.
- Do not attempt to cross a flooding stream on foot or by car.
- If you car stalls in high water, abandon it immediately and seek higher ground.
- Keep children away from flood water, ditches, culverts and storm drains.

IF A FLOOD THREATENS YOUR HOME, PROTECT YOUR PROPERTY BY DOING THE FOLLOWING:

- Open basement windows to let water in to equalize pressure.
- Move important or expensive items to a higher floor.
- Put small appliances in plastic bags and store in a high place.
- Remember to lock your house if you must evacuate.
- Turn off water, gas and electric at shut off points.
