Orange City School District Residents Pass Recreation 5-Year Renewable .95-mil Levy

Pepper Pike, Ohio: Orange Community Education & Recreation (OCER) is pleased to announce the passing of Issue 30, a 5-year renewable, .95-mil levy for the purpose of operating and maintaining its quality recreational programs and facilities.

On April 29, the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections released official preliminary results indicating Orange City School District residents passed the levy with 77% "FOR" (2,775) to 23% (816) "AGAINST" total votes. Though provisional ballots are still being counted, official results are expected May 19.

"We are grateful and humbled by the overwhelming support the community has shown through the passage of this levy," Jill Korsok, Director of OCER said. "We will continue to work hard to meet our mission of building community, one activity at a time.
