REGISTER FOR IMPORTANT PHONE CALL NOTIFICATIONS

If you have not re-registered in 2020, it is imperative that you do so in order to continue to receive important phone calls and emails from Orange Village.



CodeRed is used as a tool to quickly disperse information to the residents. You will always receive the notification via telephone. If you sign up for the email notifications through CodeRed you will receive an email as well. Please note that this is different from the electronic newsletter (enews).

You can sign up for emergency notifications only or add general notifications. The information can be sent via phone, email and text (phone and email are utilized the most). EMERGENCY notifications may include utility outages, water main breaks, trash/recycle changes or police issues. We also send GENERAL notifications concerning other matters such as planned road closures, current updates on COVID-19 or community events. HELP US TO HELP YOU!

The members of the Orange Village Fire Department hope that you are enjoying the summer. We know these can be difficult times with many COVID restrictions remaining in place. However, what better time to go over a few safety tips with members of your household so that you can assist us in our oftenheard quote: "Help Us To Help You".

<u>SUMMERTIME THUNDERSTORMS:</u> We remind you often, but please remind your family members that thunderstorms often bring down electrical wires and these wires can be deadly. Recently we have had several storms that brought down limbs, entire trees and utility poles. In all cases, electrical lines were tangled with these obstructions and posed serious danger. If you see a wire, assume it to be live even when you are positive it is not.

FIRE SAFETY: Did you know that in addition to working smoke alarms the best fire safety practice in the home is to sleep with your doors closed? We are willing to bet many of you do not practice this easy and life saving measure. By closing your bedroom door you are effectively stopping the fire in its tracks. Smoke alarms will wake you up and allow you to exit through a window or other safe means of egress. Any firefighter can relate the stark difference in appearance when the fire is out and a bedroom door is opened that was originally closed and therefore protecting the occupants.

MEDICAL EMERGENCIES: As with fire, the best outcome in a medical emergency is dependent on time. While on scene, our Paramedics are trained to determine which hospital selection is best based on the patient's vital signs and status. You can help by calling 911 early. Go over the common medical emergencies in your home and call immediately for chest pain, signs of stroke, difficulty breathing and possible allergic reactions. All of these emergencies can escalate quickly and our interventions have a higher success rate if we administer them early in the emergency.

"Petiquette"

To all dog owners in Orange Village, please know that there is legislation regarding removal of feces and barking or howling animals:

505.085 Removal of dog feces. No person being the owner or in charge or control of any dog, shall permit such dog to commit a nuisance on school grounds, Village grounds or other public property, or upon any private property other than the property of such owner or person without the permission of the owner of such property. The owner or person in charge or control of such dog shall immediately remove all feces deposited by such dog and dispose of the same in a sanitary manner.

505.09 Barking or howling dogs. No person shall keep or harbor any dog within the municipality which by frequent and habitual barking, howling or yelping, creates loud and disturbing poison of such a character intensity and duration as to disturb the posses, guide

disturbing noises of such a character, intensity and duration as to disturb the peace, quiet and good order of the municipality.

505.01 Dogs or other animals running at large. No owner can allow a dog to run at large. All dogs must be on a leash when they are being walked.

Let's be very conscious of the law as responsible dog owners in order to enjoy our pets and provide a safe and healthy environment for everyone in Orange Village.

Recycling Opportunities

Branch Chipping

The Orange Village Service Department will be collecting branches and brush on **July 20** and **September 14**.

- ▲ DO NOT mix leaves, grass clippings or yard material
- ▲ Limbs should be placed with cut ends toward the road, no more than 2 feet high and 3 feet wide
- ▲ DO NOT make large piles

Wood Chips

Orange Village delivers wood chips free of charge to residents. An approximate load size is 10 yards. Requests are honored in the order they are received, while supplies last. Place your order online at

This service is not intended to chip complete trees or for use by a commercial tree service provider.

Scrap Tire Collection Sept. 1-17

The Service Department will collect tires that are removed from the rim. You may drop off your tires Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at 4680 Lander Road.

Computer Collection August 3 through 28

Computer equipment including printers, modems, tablets, cables, cell phones and video games.

Household Hazardous Waste Collection

August 7 and September 4

Orange Village will accept unwanted oilbased paint, pesticides and other household hazardous waste.

Collections are located at Orange Village Service Department, 4680 Lander Road between 7 a.m. and 3 p.m.

Recycle American Flags

Orange Village Service Department offers a flag drop off box at the recycle center. You may drop your flags off during our HHW/Computer Collection day, the first Friday of every month from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Please place the flags in the specially marked container.



CONTAINER RENTAL SERVICE OFFERED

Orange Village will drop off a 6, 8, 10 or 12 yard container through November (weather permitting) to help dispose of brush, yard waste, construction debris or household debris. You cannot mix items in the container but you can choose from several different types of materials to dispose. Costs vary depending on the items that will be disposed of. ROTARY CLUB OFFERS MONETARY DONATION DURING COVID-19 CRISIS



The Census Bureau Nonresponse Followup

The Census Bureau routinely "soft launches" operations to ensure systems, operations and field plans work as they should. Starting in mid-July, six area census offices (ACOs) (one per census region) will begin the operation of interviewing households that have yet to respond to the



begin the operation of interviewing households that have yet to respond to the 2020 Census. Additional ACOs will be announced for a second wave soft launch to occur later in July. Aside from ACOs that are part of the soft launch, all remaining ACOs will begin the Nonresponse Followup on August 11 and conclude no later than October 31.

All census takers will be trained on social distancing protocols. They will be issued PPE and will follow local guidelines for their use.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

Orange Village is fortunate to have many attractive homes and neighborhoods. It is thanks to you, our residents, that we remain such a picturesque village.

Property owners are responsible to maintain their yards, fences, driveways and buildings in good condition and repair. Maintaining lawns and plantings and keeping buildings painted and roofs, gutters, windows and doors well maintained is required by the Orange Village Property Maintenance Code.

The Orange Village Building Department annually inspects properties street by street in an ongoing effort to maintain our community. We can only inspect from the street for any violations. If we notice a code violation, we will leave a door tag identifying the issue in need of correction, or simply asking the resident to contact us. Failure to address a problem will lead to a formal order for repair. Ultimately, failure to address a maintenance violation results in an order to appear in Bedford Heights Municipal Court. Due to the ongoing efforts of most of our residents, court action is rarely required.

The Orange Village Building Department will continue to inspect properties needing maintenance, but we appreciate hearing about any concerns that you may have, so that we can all work together to keep our Village beautiful.





Native plants work above and below the ground to benefit our environment. Above, they provide habitat for important pollinators and other wildlife, and below their longroot systems help to soak in stormwater and filter out pollutants. They are adapted to our local climate and are low maintenance so you can enjoy your yard more while it works for all of us.
