By the time you read this newsletter, summer will be halfway over. I hope everyone is taking advantage of the warm weather and enjoying all the recreational amenities available in Orange Village. It is great to see so many people utilizing the recreational trails.

ORANGE VILLAGE PARK

Due to high demand for pickleball, we are going to construct a second court for our residents. The permanent restroom building should be arriving soon. We have been preparing the site and are awaiting delivery. The permanent restroom will be a welcome addition to our community park.

ORANGE VILLAGE RECREATIONAL TRAILS

The contractor is working their way through the installation of the trails on Orangewood Drive. We will also be installing a trail from Waterford Court north to Woodmere Village's municipal boundary line. Woodmere Village is constructing a new sidewalk on Brainard Road north to Chagrin Boulevard. This will enable pedestrians a safe route to walk all the way to Chagrin Boulevard via a trail or sidewalk. We estimate the entire project will finally be complete this fall (after 3 seasons of construction!).

WEST ASH LANE

We have contracted for a complete reconstruction of West Ash Lane. The contractor anticipates beginning construction in Mid-August. The work should take approximately 8 weeks. Orange Village will notify affected residents prior to the start of construction.

SUMMER SAFETY CHECK

The members of the Orange Village Fire Department would like to reiterate some of our past safety tips so that each home within the Village can perform a "Summer Safety Check". Your safety is literally what defines our job. As we have stated in the past you can "Help Us To Help You" so that we are true partners when it comes to your safety and the safety of those that you love.

Pool Safety

- Supervise constantly: Good supervision means you are able to scan the pool area every 20 seconds and be able to reach the pool in 10 seconds.
- Always check the pool first if a child is missing: Child drowning is often a silent death that alerts
 no one with splashes or yells for help. Many drowning accidents happen when children have been
 missing for less than five minutes.
- Empty small wading pools and remove all toys after children are through playing: Infants can drown
 in just a few inches of water. Floats, balls and other toys may attract children to the pool when it is
 unattended.

Backyard Safety

- Keep grills at least 10 feet from any structure: Grilling mishaps cause more than 8,300 fires and send 3,000 people to the emergency room each year. Never grill indoors or near garages or porches, even if it's raining.
- Have a spray bottle with water or fire extinguisher handy: An unexpected flare up can burn more than your burgers. Use a spray bottle to avoid flare ups and have a fire extinguisher nearby.
- Avoid placing old coals in garbage can or in debris piles. Day old coals can still prove to be a fire hazard.
- Never use gasoline or kerosene to light a charcoal fire: Both can cause an explosion or lead to severe burns.
- Check gas grill hoses for cracking, holes and leaks: If the tank valve or grill needs repair, do not
 attempt to do it yourself. Take it to your local home improvement store or qualified appliance repair
 person.
- In the past month the Chagrin Valley has experienced at least three house fires related to the improper use of grills and propane accessories.

Playground Safety

• Carefully inspect backyard playground equipment: According to the Consumer Product Safety Commission, 70% of all playground-related injuries occur on home playground equipment. Make sure equipment is anchored safely in the ground, all equipment pieces are in good working order, S-hooks are entirely closed and bolts are not protruding.

CANS FOR BURNED CHILDREN



Orange Village Fire Department collects aluminum beverage cans for recycling. All profits benefit the Aluminum Cans for Burned Children Foundation.

In 1986 the Northern Ohio Fire Fighters, the Northeast Fire Chiefs' Association, along with Metro Health Medical Center of Cleveland began the Aluminum Cans for Burned Children Foundation (ACBC) to help children who suffer severe burn injuries.

If you would like to separate these cans from your other recyclables, please deposit them in the recycle bins located on the south entrance to Village Hall by the Fire Station, 4600 Lander Road.

Do Not Knock Registration

Orange Village Council enacted legislation that allows residents to add their property to a "Do Not Knock Registry". When you sign up for the registry you will receive a sticker that should be displayed on/near your front door. The registry will be kept by the Orange Village Police Department and made available to anyone that requests it as well as all peddlers that register with the police department to go door to door. The registry will advise the person of the properties that do not wish to receive uninvited guests, thus stopping them prior to entering onto your property.

Peddlers are those individuals selling goods or services door to door for profit (e.g. the typical door-to-door salesperson)

Canvassers are those individuals travelling from residence to residence within the Village, without having a previous appointment to visit the residence, for the purpose of disseminating any lawful message (e.g. political, religious, or not-for-profit organization), either with or without soliciting funds or donations.

Please note that canvassers do not have to register with the police department and may not receive the "Do Not Knock Registry" listing. If you have a DO NOT KNOCK sticker a canvasser may approach your home BUT they are not permitted to knock on the door or ring the doorbell. A canvasser may leave literature at or on your door.

It will be a violation of the law for a peddler to knock on the door or ring the doorbell of any property that is registered on the "Do Not Knock Registry". It is also a violation for any canvasser to knock or ring the doorbell of any property that DISPLAYS a Do Not Knock sticker that states "Canvassers and Peddlers PROHIBITED.

Child Car Seat Safety Checks



School Bus Safety

Summer break will be ending soon, and the school season will begin. Orange Village Police Department would like to remind you of the applicable vehicle laws when operating near a school bus. Ohio law requires that when the red lights on the bus are flashing, vehicles are to stop at least 10 feet from the front or rear of the bus. The diagram shows when Ohio law requires vehicles to stop when operating near a school bus.

Recycling Opportunities

Branch Chipping

The Orange Village Service Department will be collecting branches and brush on **September 13** (this is the last branch chipping for 2021).

- DO NOT mix leaves, grass clippings or yard material
- Limbs should be placed with cut ends toward the road, no more than 2 feet high and 3 feet wide
- DO NOT make large piles

Wood Chips

Orange Village delivers wood chips free of charge to residents. An approximate load size is 10 yards. Requests are honored in the order they are received, while supplies last. Place your order online at

This service is not intended to chip complete trees or for use by a commercial tree service provider.

The Service Department will collect tires that are removed from the rim. You may drop off your tires Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at 4680 Lander Road.

Household Hazardous Waste First Friday of Every Month

Recycle American Flags

Orange Village Service Department offers a flag drop off box at the recycle center. You may drop your flags off during our HHW/Computer Collection day, the first Friday of every month from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Please place the flags in the specially marked container.



Recycle Metal

A drop-off dumpster is available for ferrous and non-ferrous recyclables. It is located at the Service Department, 4680 Lander Road by the salt shed and is marked with a sign under the overhang. It is for "Metals only" - no other trash or products.

Not only does the program allow for us to reduce landfill costs, it also earns money for scrap.

CONTAINER RENTAL SERVICE

Orange Village will drop off a 6, 8, 10 or 12 yard container through November (weather permitting) to help dispose of brush, yard waste, construction debris or household debris. You cannot mix items in the container but you can choose from several different types of materials to dispose. Costs vary depending on the items that will be disposed of. Relearning Recycling

We're all learning about the impact of placing the wrong items in our recycling bins. The world's recycling economy has been reeling from many different factors, including contamination, and recycling properly is more important than ever. Below is a listing of items that can and cannot be recycled. Use this as a guide but remember that when recycling plastics, the rule is bottles and jugs only. A good trick for plastics is the neck or opening must be smaller than the body.
